MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- MUST BE AT LEAST 18 YEARS OLD
- NON-SMOKER
- NO FELONY RECORDS.
- MEET THE PHYSICAL FITNESS REQUIREMENTS RECOMMENDED IN NFPA 1582
- HOLD A VALID AND INSURABLE OR DRIVER'S LICENSE
- MAINTAIN A 2.5 GPA WITH A C GRADE MINIMUM IN EACH CLASS
